# Office of Homeless Care and Coordination (OHCC)

- Established in December 2019
  - Alameda County Board of Supervisors authorized the creation of the Office of Homeless Care and Coordination (OHCC) within the Health Care Services Agency
- ■Since inception, consolidation of homeless efforts include:
  - Management of <u>Coordinated Entry</u> an approach to coordination and management of the crisis response system's resources that allows users to make equity consistent decisions from available information to connect people efficiently and effectively to interventions that will end their homelessness.
  - Coordination of supportive services for current and future homeless housing units in the pipeline addition of new PSH sites
  - Pandemic response and risk mitigation of Safer Ground and Isolation Quarantine 9 leased non-congregate shelter sites
  - HHIS contracts and staff transitioned under OHCC; expansion to **CalAIM Housing Community Supports**
  - Strategic planning efforts and development of **Home Together 2026** plan

## CONTINUUM OF HOMELESS SERVICES

- Coordinated Entry
- Housing Problem Solving/Service Access Points
- Emergency/crisis housing including COVID-19 non-congregate shelter
  - \*ACBH Dedicated Shelter Beds
- Housing Navigation/Tenancy Sustaining Services
- ❖ Permanent Housing Rapid Re-housing, Dedicated affordable, Shallow subsidy
- Permanent Supportive Housing
  - Supportive housing community land alliance/land trust
  - Buildings and scattered site housing subsidies
  - Licensed (board and care) Housing Support Program subsidies

## **FUNDING**

- ■Licensed (board and care) HSP homes rates not keeping up with costs of doing business; significant economic and operational stressors on operators due to COVID-19
- ■Expansion of HSP homes bi-annual Request for Proposals (RFP) process
- Additional Resources added: technology funds, and damage/risk mitigation support
- Annual COLA's (3.5%) correlates to increase in tier funding
- ■DHCS unprecedented funding opportunities: CCE; BCHIP; CCE-Preservation
- ■Housing Assistance Funds support one-time/short-term assistance to secure or retain housing
- ■One-time state funding to address homelessness Project Homekey, CARES Act, HHAP, and others

# SUPPORTIVE HOUSING COMMUNITY LAND ALLIANCE (SCHLA)

- MHSA Innovation Project in Alameda County (funding to support start-up of new entity)
- \*Form a new non-profit focused on preserving and creating supportive housing for individuals with serious mental health issues
- Northern California Community Land Trust selected as an incubation and support agency
- Executive Director hired; Board of Directors formalized
- Starting conversation to explore acquisitions of licensed board and cares
- Stakeholder/focus groups part of organization formation
- Innovations ownership models, mixed use properties, nonprofit ownership of licensed care homes, specialized property management
- Evaluator selected

## **Impacts and Progress**

- ❖ During pandemic, shelter beds utilized at decompression rates; limited outbreaks and increased risk mitigation efforts
- ❖ Housing Assistance Funds supported 112 people with securing immediate housing funds
- Retaining 175 MHSA housing units; representing 23 projects
- ❖ Collaboration across agencies and stakeholders: Public Health, Health Care for the Homeless, Community Care Licensing (CCL), Office of Homeless Care and Coordination
- \*Retention of permanent housing: 98% sustaining housing
- \*Risk Mitigation, Landlord Engagement, Housing Service Coordinators tasked with bridging partnerships with new landlords, retaining housing for long-standing residents
- ❖ Shelter Model shifting one shelter to a safe haven model; resulting in targeted care and support and rapid transition to permanent supportive housing and strengthened problem-solving efforts
- \*Expansion of permanent supportive housing for individuals experiencing homelessness and SMI (new developments throughout the County; No Place Like Home)

## How can we get involved?

- ❖ National state and local levels, an example is NAMI at the national level rather than local classes can get together and take a stand with other federal coalitions around that issue
- ❖LOCAL: Have people support local housing projects. Mobilize when there are specific projects in your neighborhood
- \*LAND TRUST: Many have been involved with shaping the idea and we need this continued level of involvement
- ❖HOUSING RESOURCES WEBSITE: homelessness.acgov.org Housing Services in-development
- **❖**BOARD & CARE: Continue with this advocacy

## Legislative Update (revised 9/23/22)

AB 988 (Bauer-Kahan) Mental health: 988 crisis hotline to provide crisis intervention services & coordination.

HCSA position is to Watch. Currently bill is in the Second House Appropriations Committee

(FYI on 7/16/22 the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline went live. In Alameda County dialing 988 connects individuals to trained crisis counselors through Crisis Intervention Services.


